
### Auction At Night At The Races

# The Sunday After The Universal Elevation Of The Cross

The importance of the Cross is emphasized by the way the Byzantine Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross In the Liturgical calendar, both the Sunday before and the Sunday after the Holy day (September 14th) are specially dedicated to lessons of the



Cross. One absolute requisite to being a Christian is that one must carry a cross. There are no exceptions. The Gospel read at the Liturgy quotes Jesus saying: If anyone wishes to come after me let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow me. " There is no other way. We cannot think of Christ without also thinking of the cross. Likewise, we cannot think of a Christian. Many people look upon the crosses that enter our life as some sort of punishment from God, whereas, in reality, they are blessings from God because these daily crosses are the means of saving our soul. Without the cross, there is no salvation.

The Gospel for today asks the question: "What does it profit a man if he gain the whole world, but suffer the loss of his own soul? Or what will a. man give in exchange for his soul? So

many people avoid the cross like a plague, They run away from the cross because they do not understand what a great reward comes from carrying the cross..... a reward far greater than any wealth the world knows. It is really funny that, these same people who avoid the cross are willing to make any sacrifice if they can see some material gain in it. A pool man will do without a meal so he can purchase a lottery ticket. He is driven by the dream that he can become an instant millionaire. There are those who will work to jobs a great personal sacrifice so that they can buy a new home or a new car. There are so many who will fast rigorously so that they can lose a little weight and become slim. All of these people make great sacrifices, but for the wrong purposes. Ask these same people to give until it hurts, or to come to the church and help out on a particular project after they have worked a full day in the shop, or to fast and abstain during lent, and they will tell you it is difficult...they don't have any "spare money" to give to the church; they are too tired to come to work at church on Saturday after they have worked the whole week in the shop; they can't fast because fasting gives them a headache. Nonsense. If they can do all these things for the silly reasons we have enumerated in our last paragraph, why can't they do the same thing purely out of love for God? How foolish! Who do we think we are fooling? We are not fooling our neighbor and we are not even fooling ourselves; and we certainly are not fooling God! The Gospel for today ends with a very strong statement: "Amen, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death till they have seen the Kingdom of God coming in power." It is not too late! We still can change our way of life. We can look upon our daily crosses not as curses but as blessings from God who loved us so much that He gave his only begotten Son, to be nailed to the cross for our salvation.
