

#### A Note from Fr. Christiaan

Dear Parishioners.

Christ is Risen! As we move toward Pentecost, it might be good to review what's happened in the last few weeks to our parish facilities, just to keep you updated. About four weeks we suffered some wind damage to St. Mary's on the roof. Fortunately, our experienced parishioners who are constantly vigilant to preserve our building knew exactly who to call, upon seeking their advice and a preventive maintenance plan was hatched to cut back pesky trees which are the culprits. What is more, at St. George's we have had a challenge three weeks ago with a bad radiator leaking. The costly repair was performed by my own service provider at the Byzantine Seminary in Pittsburgh. Both it and the St. Mary damages were substantial, being between three and four thousand dollars each. Because of our generous and industrious volunteers for pierogis at both parishes, we can confront the challenge for the most part. What is more, we also have a newer challenge at St. George's with a porch collapsing in the back of the hall, for which I expect the results of this week's estimate in the upcoming week.

In old business, due to the diligence of Fr. Geoff, I've received one estimate on the St. George parking lot repair and pavement venture. Once all three estimates are in, then I can submit the plan (which being over 7, 500 USD requires consultation with the Archeparchy by statute) for approval but will consult with St. George's parish council to see if there is a positive consensus, prior to submitting to the chancery in Pitt. What I am learning through these experiences is that there are many committed parishioners at both parishes. Not only have they been generous with their time, but informative to me and truly helpful in lightening my burdens, as I am so new to our two campuses.

To get to know, so to speak, "how the sausage is made," I've begun my Aliquippa-Ambridge pierogi tour by spending time working this week at St. George in the kitchen (unsurprisingly I was immediately unmasked as an unskilled laborer) but it did not go as I had imagined it. My illomened beginning boasted of the most leaky containers in living memory so that I became literally butterfingers through the packaging process. But I definitely plan on coming back to contribute to the work that keeps our lights on and our doors open for divine worship! This coming week, it is my plan to help at St. Mary's Church with their pierogi team. I anticipate an early morning but the same or similar enjoyment that had at St. George's. This part of ministry is great for getting to see you all and working with you to boot. By the way, if you got butter all over yourself this week from St. George's pierogi packs leaking, I was in charge of quality control... so, you're welcome!

## The Gospel Accounts of the Visits of the Myrrh-Bearers to the Tomb



After examining all the accounts of the movements, visions and testimonies of the Myrrh-bearing women, the following conclusions present themselves:

The Myrrh-bearers did not go all together to the tomb, but in separate groups and at different times. The first visit was of Mary Magdalene (Gospel of St. John); the second visit was of Joanna with other women (Gospel of St. Luke); the third visit was of Mary, the mother of James and Salome (Gospels of Ss. Matthew and Mark). All of this is evident and clearly apparent from the details of the Gospel accounts.

The time sequence of the holy women's visits to the tomb unfolds itself as follows: Mary Magdalene, while it was still dark; Joanna, with the others, very early in the morning; Mary the mother of James and Salome, when the sun was rising. This is thus a series of non-simultaneous events. And all these events embrace a time span of several hours – from the dark before the dawn to the rising of the sun.

First Visit: Mary Magdalene alone goes to the tomb while it is still dark. She saw the stone rolled away, her first thought is, "They have taken the Lord away." She runs to tell the Apostles Peter and John, who set out for the tomb.

Second Visit: While the Apostles Peter and John are on their way to the tomb, Joanna and the other women arrive at the open tomb. Angels explain to them the mystery of the absence of the Lord's body. They leave and go tell the Apostles. Meanwhile, Apostles Peter and John with Mary Magdalene reach the tomb without having met Joanna and her companions. After the Apostles leave, Mary Magdalene remains at the tomb and is blessed with an appearance of the Lord. She then sets out again to the Apostles.

Third Visit: After Mary Magdalene's departure, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome come to the tomb with companions. An angel reassures them that the Lord is risen. They enter the tomb and another angel repeats what the first had told them. The angel tells them to go and tell the Apostles everything related to them. As they are running, the Lord Himself appears to them.
