

#### A Note from Fr. Christiaan

#### Dear Parishioners,

Christ is Risen! I look forward to our Monday evening vesperal liturgy that welcomes in the Holy and Great St. George, Martyr. We'll celebrate at 6 pm as per usual. Additionally, next weekend marks our solemn Sunday celebration of St. George, with mirovanije and a meal, commencing at 10 am. Remember there will be *only* one common liturgy at St. George's church for both parishes on that day!

More interesting than perhaps any other thing in life right now are the questions following my initial pierogi tour: What happened, how did it go? Well, although I did not have the disastrous effect of my presence on the quality of packages (thus, no butter all over me after working), St. Mary's team left me with an education as well. First, some pinchers and cooks alike began to think of me as a "thaumaturge" that is a "wonderworker" like some of our saints. Why? I entered into the basement all in black, at which time I was warned that I would leave looking like a powdered donut. However, I caused marvel and awe after a couple hours avoiding getting flour on myself, though I was a doughmule. The community remains divided whether I have special powers or I skillfully pretended to work being without normal human signs of touching flour. Could I have just spent all my time hanging around coffee stand? In response, my initial efforts to frequent the coffee stand continually were thwarted by the constant presence of George there. So, I quickly understood he kept an eye on the workers or the coffee, making such a plan DOA. How I managed to do it remains a clerical secret. Now, St. Mary's was a different experience. Whereas at St. George's I learned how to package and mark pierogi containers, failing to convince them that I could handle a live pierogi without harming it, St. Mary's George put me in the thick of it immediately. I was relishing the opportunity to be instructed in the mysteries of the pierogi, what were its secrets and to be initiated in such matters.

In reality, my real lessons at St. Mary's were learning about the fact that my sermons were timed and had far surpassed the limit imposed the Holy Tradition of my predecessors. Instead of finding the recipe to any secret sauce, I spent discovered myself honing my debate and rhetorical skills to convince some pinchers that they needed to move forward in the pews and that I don't have to move to the back of the church to hear! I had forgotten to assure them that they might want to move up and hear a sermon first before they again petition me to preach in the nave. After all, should they hear a sermon first, then maybe they'll have buyer's remorse only to use our next joint pierogi experience to convince me to return back to the sanctuary pulpit for preaching (after realizing they should have been careful what they asked for)! In short, St. Mary's was an entertaining education. I think the major take aways for me were: The kraut pinchers are at the top of the pincher pyramid and that it is a best practice, if barely socially acceptable, to keep passing water through the same coffee filter and simply add more grounds as needed. All in all, it's been very fun. So, naturally, I will be back for more before the end of the season.

Thanks to all you volunteers who keep our parishes going! It's good to be a small part of your sacrifices of time and effort to ensure that we can gather each Sunday in our own facilities and give God his due. Christ is risen!

# Sunday of the Paralytic Man


How tragic today's story of life is...A man had been paralyzed for thirty-eight years. He had lain at a short distance from healing, but he, himself, had no strength to merge into the waters of ablution. And no one - no one in the course of all these years - had had compassion on him.

We are surrounded by people who are in need. It is not only people who are physically paralyzed who need help. There are so many people who are paralyzed in themselves, and need to meet someone who would help them. Paralyzed in themselves are those who are terrified of life, because life has been an object of terror for them since they were born: insensitive parents, heartless, brutal surroundings. How

many are those who hoped, when they were still small, that there would be something for them in life. But no, there wasn't. There was no compassion. There was no friendliness. There was nothing...

So we are surrounded, all of us, by people who are in the situation of this paralytic man. Do you see that paralyzed person in your life, in your family or in your neighborhood? As Christians we are responsible for each of them. We are responsible, mutually, for one another; because when we look right and left at the people who stand by us, what do we know about them? Do we know how broken they are? How much pain there is in their hearts? How much agony there has been in their lives? How many broken hopes, how much fear and rejection and contempt that has made them contemptuous of themselves and unable even to respect themselves - not to speak of having the courage of making a move towards wholeness, that wholeness of which the Gospel speaks in this passage and in so many other places?

On this Sunday, let us look at one another with understanding, with attention. Christ is there. He can heal; yes. But we will be answerable for each other, because there are so many ways in which we should be the eyes of Christ who sees the needs, the ears of Christ who hears the cry, the hands of Christ who supports and heals or makes it possible for the person to be healed. Let us look at this Gospel reading of the paralytic with new eyes; not thinking of this poor man two thousand years ago who was so lucky that Christ happened to be near him and in the end did what every neighbor should have done. Let us look at each other and have compassion, active compassion; insight; love if we can. And then this Gospel reading will not have been spoken or this event will not have been related to us in vain. Amen.



Yet it is an appropriate image, because it reflects his courage in challenging powerful evil, and overcoming its might through prayer. The image reminds us that we also must stand up to evil and defend the faith. We also need to be people of prayer who can face "dragons" of various kinds rather than running away from them.

#### **Mid-Pentecost**

Mid-Pentecost celebrates the midpoint between the feasts of Pascha and Pentecost. Specifically, it falls on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of Pascha, this year April 24. The theme of the feast is Christ as Teacher, based upon the words of the Gospel of the day (John 7:14-30): "Now about the midst of the feast Jesus went up into the temple, and taught... Jesus answered them and said, My doctrine is not mine, but his that sent me. If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself."
