

A Note from Fr. Christiaan

Dear Parishioners,

Thanks so much for letting me know your thoughts last week on announcement of your new permanent priest. I continue regularly to speak with Fr. Anthony Costantino and to prepare to welcome him. I start up these next two weeks training deacon candidates at your seminary. Our Byzantine Churches in three years may ordain about fifteen deacons (God willing) to serve like Dcn. Tom! I am privileged to organize their summer program each year, including two liturgical celebrations each day (typically Divine Liturgy and Vespers), meals, social time, and – yes – education, which lets out before the 04 July weekend. I teach them the history of dogmas and about pastoral care, that is the situations that our people can expect us to help them in their life challenges (alcohol/drugs, divorce, marriage, and much more).

I also fly to North Carolina this coming Friday to give a retreat on Friday and Saturday, which I had scheduled before coming to our parishes on 31 January. My plane should get back Saturday night. I may try to contact a priest as an insurance policy since I'm nervous about airports. It's pretty difficult to find a sub these days, as Byzantine priests are becoming as rare as white rhinos. But maybe I'll get lucky.

Lastly, I told you that we had clergy days or clergy-business meetings over a week ago. The policies we reviewed were really helpful. They ensure professionalism in our administration where it has been lackluster in the past. One important development is that we administrators are held to appropriate expectations for a safe environment for both children and vulnerable adults (who may not have use of their all their mental or physical faculties). I spoke with Fr. Anthony and we agreed that he'd need to review what are called "clearances" or simple documents for employees and volunteers so that they are safe to be around children. They are supposed to be updated every five years. As priests we should find a way to make this process simple, non-invasive of your time (as possible), and convenient as possible. Fr. Anthony will be reviewing this when he takes the helm. It is good for you to know that some positions at our parishes require – especially since our archbishop and curia presented this information on 05 June - background checks. Just to give you perspective, as a seminarian (I volunteered and was unpaid), in 8 years I had to take two psychological tests of many hours, go through criminal background checks, child safety training, and a number of workshops to make sure – as far as humanly possible – that I am trustworthy in an administrative position for protecting the vulnerable in our parishes. My records are stored with the Archeparchy. This is exactly what will happen with some who need to do *less paperwork*, as volunteers, only clearances and child protection training. Your parish priest, Archbishop William, Fr. Andrew Deskevich (Protosyncellus), and Sr. Joanne Licvar (Safe environment coordinator) have access to my records (as yours): criminal background information and child safety training for those designated in our parishes to have supervisory roles that put them in contact with children (potentially) or with adults for whom they can be held to be liable for their wellbeing. I respect the desire of anybody who wishes all information, including SS #s, to remain completely private. Certain roles, when we have influence on others or charge of their wellbeing bring with them a legal liability when we volunteer in a church. We no longer represent only our private interests but become legally representatives of our church. So, the archeparchy needs us to make sure that all our leaders and employees are presentable to have charge over others. I'll write more about this process soon! Fr. Christiaan


Fourth Sunday after Pentecost

How great must have been the faith of the Centurion who came to Christ asking for a healing of his servant, whom he loved, who was faithful to him. He heard Christ say, "I will come and heal him.", and he could answer, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; but only say the word, and my servant will be healed."

This is an event of the life of Christ; it is an event that touched not only the Centurion, not only his servant, but every member of the household. He came without Christ, and the servant was healed. Who of us, in dire, agonizing pain is capable of turning to the Lord, present Him his request, ask Him to show mercy and to manifest His power, and when the Lord says to us, in our hearts, 'I shall come, I shall work this miracle for you' - who of us would have the courage to say, 'No, Lord! Your word is enough!'...

And again, who of us, at moments when the Lord came close to us, have the thought of saying such words, realizing because of the holiness of Christ, the holiness of God, how unworthy we are of Him, of His life, His teaching, His example, His death, His descent into hell, to the very rock bottom of evil. And this hell is not only an image; isn't it within us? Isn't there in us a darkness that needs more than enlightenment - the Light of God, God, the light of the world.

On this Sunday the amazing centurion's faith was manifested. So often when we pray, we ask the Lord insistently to come close to us, to make His presence felt, so that we may clearly feel His power. This man acted with great simplicity, saying to Christ, "No don't trouble yourself to come. I am a sinful man and not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but just say the word and my servant will be healed. One word from God - that was what the man asked for, not the joy of contact which we all long. Today, we ask the Lord that He should fulfill our requests and, in addition to that, grant us the miraculous joy of His presence. Amen. As children of Almighty God we stand before many challenges in this world. One of them is choosing the right Master. Which one will it be? Let us choose the ONE that will keep our lives "full of light", full of happiness and true joy. Let us put the spiritual first, and then all other things will work out around that for our good and spiritual benefit of our loved ones. Amen.


