

This week we celebrate a Solemn Feast Day in our Church, St. Nicholas the Wonderworker, Archbishop of Myra in Lycia. He is the Patron Saint of Byzantine Catholics in America so this is a big feast for us and we will be having several celebrations!

We will have a 6:00pm Vesperal Liturgy at St. George's on Thursday, December 5th, followed by a talk by two friends of mine from Detroit, who will be sharing their story of radically following Jesus and doing mission work in inner city Detroit. Twenty-Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

In Luke 18:18-27, we find a rich young ruler who approaches Jesus with a question about eternal life. This encounter gives us valuable insights into the nature of salvation and the challenges that wealth can present.

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The rich young ruler begins by addressing Jesus as "Good Teacher" and asks what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus responds by reminding him of the commandments, to which the young man claims he has faithfully adhered since his youth. However, Jesus challenges him further, instructing him to sell all his possessions, give to the poor, and follow Him.




This response shocks the young ruler, as he is very wealthy. He walks away saddened, unable to let go of his material possessions. Jesus then remarks that it is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God.

This passage highlights the tension between wealth and discipleship. While riches can provide comfort and security, they can also hinder one's ability to fully surrender to God. Jesus emphasizes the need to prioritize our relationship with Him over material possessions, reminding us that true wealth lies in following Him wholeheartedly.

St. Nicholas Day, December 6

Saint Nicholas, Archbishop of Myra is transformed in our modern secular culture as Santa Claus - the man in the red suit who brings gifts at Christmas to all those who are good. It is interesting - and telling to consider what the Church remembers him for. Yes, he is said to have punched Arias in the nose for denying the divinity of Jesus. But most of the stories that come to us through history are of him living the Christian life - like providing a dowry to three young women so they could marry and avoid slavery (the three bags of gold he threw through their windows landed in their stockings, and so today we hang our stockings by the chimney with care). All of the stories about



Archbishop Nicholas that come to us through history are about his love for people - especially the poor. St. Nicholas was good. So good that his goodness shines through history - and radiates even from the man in the red suit. Such goodness can only be found in one who dwells intimately with the Lord - for He is the only good One (Mt 19:17).
