

# Pirohi Sale This Week





#### The Theotokos of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, Dec. 12

The Theotokos of Guadalupe first appeared on Dec. 9, 1531, in Mexico to St. Juan Diego, bestowing on him an icon "not made with human hands," requesting that a church be built in her honor on that mountain. Her shrine there is one of the most celebrated places of pilgrimage in the Americas. Pope John Paul II named her the Patroness of the Americas.

The horizon of hope! This is the horizon that makes for a good journey. The season of Advent ... restores this horizon of hope, a hope which does not disappoint for it is founded on God's Word. A hope which does not disappoint, simply because the Lord never disappoints! He is faithful! He does not disappoint! Let us think about and feel this beauty.



"The model of this spiritual disposition, of this way of being and journeying in life, is the Virgin Mary. A simple girl from the country who carries within her heart the fullness of hope in God! ### The Maternity of St. Anna, December 8

According to tradition, Joachim and Anna were childless for fifty years of their married life. In their old age, they were promised that a daughter would be born to them. After nine months, St. Anna bore a daughter, blessed by God and by all subsequent generations of humanity: the most holy Theotokos, the ever-virgin Mary. St. Anna was the youngest daughter of the priest Nathan from Bethlehem, descended from the tribe of Levi. She married St. Joachim, who was a native of Galilee. The Conception of the



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Virgin Mary by St. Anna took place in Jerusalem. In the icon for this feast, saints Joachim and Anna are usually depicted with hands folded in prayer; their eyes are also directed upward and they contemplate the Mother of God, who stands in the air with outstretched hands; under her feet is an orb encircled by a serpent (symbolizing the devil), which strives to conquer all the universe by its power. There are also icons in which St. Anna holds the Theotokos on her left arm as an infant. On St. Anna's face is a look of reverence. Traditionally, this Feast is especially venerated by pregnant women.

And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus's feet, giving Him thanks.

In healing the ten lepers, Jesus revealed his power and glory. Yet only one of the lepers returned to acknowledge Jesus' glory and to give Him thanks. And that one was a Samaritan, a foreigner. What happened to the other nine? What went wrong with them that went right with the Samaritan? The nine were right with the Samaritan? The nine were blinded to the truth of what Jesus did and who He was. They were so wrapped up in themselves, in their illness and their healing, that they failed to give glory to the One who cleansed them.



Are we so different? We live in an age when the experiences and accomplishments of this world are the only things that are held to be of any value. As we read in St. Paul's second letter to the Corinthians 4:4: "The god of this world [Satan] has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the likeness of God". There is a spiritual battle going on in the world and in us. Satan is out to take away the vision of Jesus as our healer.

The Fathers of the Church see a lesson in today's Gospel reading for us. The ten lepers signify mankind. We are all leprous, but only one in ten give thanks to God for the salvation He has brought to us. In the same way, only some of the seed sown by God (in the Parable of the Sower) brings forth good fruit. We can all be cleansed by Him, but if we do not return to Him in gratitude and to glorify Him, we cannot be saved.

It is only by the power of the Holy Spirit that we can win the battle that is going on inside us. The role of the Holy Spirit is to reveal to us who Jesus is and to convict us of our state. As we see that we are infected with the leprosy of sin, and as we experience the healing that Jesus has performed within us through the shedding of His blood on the cross, we can turn back to Him, fall on our knees at his feet, and thank Him, acknowledging His power and glory.

**How do you glorify God?** – The Lord expressed love for the one who was thankful, but He was angry with the ungrateful ones because they did not acknowledge their Deliverer. They thought more highly of their cure from leprosy than of He who had healed them. ... The one who returned to give thanks was given much more than the rest. Besides being healed of his leprosy, he was told by the Lord, "Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you." You see, those who give thanks and those who glorify have the same kind of feelings. They bless their helper for the benefits they have received. This is why Paul urged everyone to "glorify God with your body." (1 Cor 6:20). (*Saint Athanasius*)
