

A Note from Fr. Anthony

Dear Parishioners,

This Thursday the Church prescribes the celebration of the Great Canon of St. Andrew of Crete. This is a very long penitential prayer that takes place usually during the context of Matins with many prostrations and is an important part of our Byzantine tradition. We are celebrating it in the evening due to the schedule of our cantors. It is normally a three-hour service, but we have abbreviated it significantly and my best guess is it will last approximately an hour and a half. Even if you can't stay for the whole thing, you are most welcome to come for part of it and leave when you need to. Since a Presanctified Liturgy is actually properly celebrated this evening, I will distribute Communion at the end of our celebration. Wednesday to Friday this week are days of mitigated fasting (wine and oil traditionally permitted) to strengthen the faithful so they can participate in this beautiful service. In this spirit, we will have a light social following our celebration of the Great Canon.

A reminder that this Saturday, April 5th is Akathistos Saturday. We will be singing the Akathist at 8:15am followed by Divine Liturgy at 9am. We will then be hosting a Lenten breakfast and talk by Dr. John Rao in conjunction with the Woodlawn Council Knights of Columbus. **Please sign up in the back of the Church or let me know by today if you wish to attend the talk and breakfast.** Please turn in nomination forms for parish finance council in the collection basket or to me.

Following Mother Cecilia's talk at St. George, several people expressed interest in seeing Christ the Bridegroom Monastery. On Wednesday, April 16th, the monastery will be having their patronal celebration of Bridegroom Matins celebrated by Bishop Robert Pipta at 10:00am. We will be having a combined parish field trip to the monastery in honor of this joyful occasion. We will depart St. Mary's at 8:00am, join the nuns for Matins, stop for a fast-friendly lunch in the area (Thai food, everyone is responsible for paying for their own meal), and return to St. Mary's mid-afternoon. Sign-up sheets are in the back of both parishes.

I am very much looking forward to celebrating Holy Week and Pascha with all three of our communities. I recognize it can be disappointing to some that the schedule has had to be adjusted from what has been done in years past. Serving three Churches creates logistical complications as I am one priest and cannot be in three places at the same time. Please note as well we have approximately twice as many Holy Week liturgies as in years past so there are ample opportunities for us to pray and come together as a community of Byzantine Catholics in Beaver County. Furthermore, a lot of when I scheduled services and what services I scheduled at each location had to do with the availability of cantors. For instance, 2 out of 3 of St. Mary's primary cantors will be absent for Holy Week and Pascha. I understand wanting certain celebrations in one's own Church which is why each parish is having its own Paschal liturgy. For the other services, my hope is our communities can come together and celebrate them in a more beautiful and prayerful manner than if we repeated the same service multiple times. With this in mind, I have had at least 2 people offer to give rides between St. George's and St. Mary's for our divine services beginning on Holy Thursday up through Holy Saturday morning. **Beginning next week, we will have sign-ups in the back of the Church for any parishioners who would like rides from St. George's to St. Mary's or vice-versa for these services.**

Fourth Sunday of the Great Fast

And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him; and when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has he had this?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you can do anything, have pity on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible to him who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!"



On this Sunday Our Lord says to the father: "Bring him to me". One of the great secrets of life is to be found in these few words...Bring him to me! When we have a sickness or a problem, we as followers of Christ always have someone to whom we can go. We recall the words of Our Lord: "Come to Me all you who are tired from carrying your heavy burdens and I will give you rest" (Mt 11:28). How many cries for help we hear every day! If we try to help alone, we are helpless. But if we believe in Christ, it is our mission to bring them to the true Helper, the Divine Physician of our souls and bodies. As parents, friends, employers, fellow workers, we can be Our Lord's helpers. But before we can bring others to Christ, we must bring ourselves to Him. We must let Our Lord strengthen our faith. We must let him break the power of sin in our lives and set us free.

Our Lord performed two miracles today. He not only healed the epileptic boy; He also increased the father's faith. From saying: "If you can do anything", the desperate father reached the point where he would say: "I believe!" His one sentence prayer; "I believe; help my unbelief!" showed that he did not possess complete and absolute faith. He expressed and acted on the faith he had, but he did not hide his doubt. He was honest with Christ. No person believes perfectly. But the important thing is whether we let ourselves be controlled by the faith we have or by our doubts. Miracles happen not because of perfect faith, but rather because of imperfect faith in the perfect Christ.

In the Epistle appointed for this Sunday, we learn about the "oath" which God has made with us. What is an oath? Saint Paul tells us in the epistle that it is a "promise," a "guarantee," a "sure and firm anchor of the soul," the "final settlement" of disagreements. When two people swear an oath, they are promising to be of one mind regarding the thing promised. The oath is the outward sign of the interior union of the two parties. In the case of Jesus, the oath and promise that he makes with us is that he will take us with him beyond the "veil," and make us partakers of the divine nature. In other words, Jesus promises us that He will give us His life. Today the Lord swears an oath to us that if we willingly die to our old selves through "prayer and fasting" and promise to give ourselves to him, then the demons of our former life will be cast out, that our sins will be washed away, and that we will rise with him in His resurrection on the third day. We have hope then, having promised our life to the Lord, that when the day of Pascha arrives, we who have died with him will receive a new life in him
