

The Fathers on Scripture

Some argue that the Centurion, by his description, implied the reason why he had not brought his servant to Jesus saying, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, in terrible distress," as though he was at his last gasp, or even as Luke said, he was "at the point of death." In my opinion, however, the reason he had not brought him in was itself a sign of his great faith, even much greater than those who let the patient down through the roof. Because the Centurion knew for certain that even a mere command was enough for raising the servant up, he thought it unnecessary to bring him.

A Note from Fr. Anthony

Dear parishioners,

I am going to experiment with the morning schedule and offer 1st and 3rd Hours at 7:30am on Tuesday and Thursday at St. Mary's and 7:30am on Wednesday at St. George. We've had a good response at St. Mary and my hope is by offering it at St. George it will allow people living on the other side of the river to go to a short service (25 min) before work. If it's too exhausting for me I may reduce the number of times I offer this service but I want to give it a try.

We have our 2nd annual days of prayer for fallen-away Catholics coming up July 22nd to July 25th. I would highly encourage everyone to make an effort to attend some of the many services offered and to invite others. We have four excellent guest homilists for the evening liturgy.

First, Fr. Nathaniel Tapsak, the administrator of Holy Trinity Parish in Sykesville, PA and Nativity Parish in Dubois, PA. I spent a semester at the seminary with him when I was getting ready to serve our parishes and he is an excellent priest with a beautiful singing voice.

Second, Fr. Luke Iyengar, who is being ordained today at the Cathedral! It will be a joy to welcome a newly ordained priest of our Archeparchy who grew up in nearby McKees Rocks.

Third, Fr. Joe Freedy. Fr. Joe is the parochial vicar of Divine Grace parish in the Roman Diocese of Pittsburgh. He is known as one of the best homilists and speakers in the Pittsburgh area. He was a Division 1 college football player and played against Ben Roethlisberger before becoming a priest.

Finally, Fr. Thomas Bailey, a Benedictine Monk. He serves as the vice-rector of our Byzantine Catholic seminary and the priest at St. Mary's Romanian Catholic Church in McKeesport.

Sign-ups for ECF will be coming out shortly. After consulting the pastoral council, as well as the families involved, we will be doing one combined Beaver County ECF.

We have 11-12 children at St. Mary's coming regularly and 2-4 at St. George. Without higher numbers, it is impossible to run separate programs. We will be having classes Sundays approximately twice a month at 10:00am at St. Mary's which works best for most of the families involved and allows children to attend either parish (or St. Nicholas Chapel) for liturgy. However, we intend to have activity at St. George as well, especially since it has the longest-running ECF in the Archeparchy and wonderful facilities. We have several special events planned at St. George (which will be announced in greater detail) including a family Olympics, a teaching on Rusyn Christmas traditions before our annual St. Nicholas party, an Easter Basket making class, and a short vacation Bible school. I understand it may be disappointing to some to no longer have separate programs and I can appreciate that. However, we simply do not have volunteers to run two separate programs, and I believe it is best for the children to be learning in larger groups with more students their age. Given that we only had 3 children regularly attending the two parishes combined last summer I believe this is remarkable growth and a good sign for the future of the parishes.

But the centurion answered Him, "Lord, I am not worthy to have You come under my roof; but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I am a man under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this,' and he does it." When Jesus heard him, He marveled, and said to those who followed him, "Truly, I say to you, not even in Israel have I found such faith."

The Gospel story of the centurion tells us about a man whose faith exceeded that of the Jewish people, although he himself was a pagan. A person dear to him was ill and he came to



Christ, asking for a miracle, asking that the Lord should have mercy on him. Christ answered the man saying, "I will come, I will heal him." This is where the amazing centurion's faith was manifested. So often when we pray, we ask the Lord insistently to come close to us, to make His presence felt, so that we may clearly feel His power. This man acted with great simplicity, saying to Christ: "No don't trouble yourself to come. I am a sinful man and not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but just say the word and my servant will be healed." One word from God - that was what the man asked for, not the joy of contact which we all long. We ask the Lord that He should fulfill our requests and, in addition to that, grant us the miraculous joy of His presence.

The centurion appreciated in his heart how holy the Lord was, how great, and was ready to forgo this joy if only his friend, his servant would recover. Often we could turn to God and say, "Help me, Lord. I do not need to know what is happening, nor to feel Your action; only do Your will, silently, as it were from a distance, unnoticed by me." If only we were able to turn to God with such faith, with such a feeling of His holiness, how close the Lord would be. He is always close, He is always approaching us, but we can sense Him only with a loving and humble heart. A spark of love we sometimes have, but there is not much humility. So, if we were to turn to God and say, "Lord, let the good, the holiness that my soul longs for be fulfilled for my dear ones, and me you can leave out. Pass me by on your way to them", how the Lord would rejoice at the love which is ready to lay down its life, its joy, for others. Amen.


