

The mission of the Cross of Gratitude, that we have participated in, is dedicated to the 2000th jubilee of the Crucifixion, death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ to be celebrated in the year 2033 and to visit all capitals of the world with the hope of uniting all nations of the world into one family before the Cross of Jesus Christ, who suffered for every one of us. Its pilgrimage has taken it to 46 capitals throughout Eastern and Western Europe including Lviv, Kiev, Warsaw, Prague, Vienna, Brussels, Stockholm, Vilnius, Madrid, Dublin, Copenhagen, Helsinki, Bern, Zagreb, Andorra la Vella, Lisbon, Oslo, Athens,



Reykjavik, Rome, Paris, Amsterdam, Berlin, London, Vatican. While in the United States, the Cross has visited The Cathedral of St. Matthew the Apostle in Washington, D.C., and Ukrainian Catholic National Shrine of the Holy Family, St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York, Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul in Philadelphia, also churches in Chicago and New Jersey. Eventually, it will go to Asia, Africa and Australia. We are thankful that the Cross of Gratitude pilgrimage has come to Aliquippa!

The Holy Protection of the Mother of God, October 1

On October 1, 911, during the reign of emperor Leo the Wise, there was an all-night vigil in the Blachernae church of the Theotokos in Constantinople. Standing near the rear of the church was St. Andrew the Fool for Christ, and his disciple Epiphanius. At four o'clock in the morning, the Theotokos appeared above the people with a veil spread over her outstretched hands, as if to



protect them. She was surrounded by angels and saints. Seeing this, Andrew asked his disciple, "Do you see the Queen and Lady of all is praying for the whole world?"

Early morning Wednesday and Thursday hours are cancelled until the week of October 12th due to various scheduling conflicts.

Next week, I will be on required clergy retreat the evening of October 5th to 9th. If anyone is sick or in need of sacramental care, please tell me now, as none of the Archeparchy priests will be available, and in fact, the Roman diocese has their priest convocation that week as well. I will be checking my cellphone in case of an emergency, but I will be 2 hours away and there will be very few priests in the area for me to reach out to if a problem were to suddenly arise.

Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost

He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets."

In today's Gospel reading we are told of one of the miracles of Christ. That miracle is a great haul of fish. The Gospel starts with a scene of fishermen washing their nets. We learn that one of the fishermen is Peter. Our Lord tells Peter to take Him out in one of the boats for a catch of fish. Peter explains his doubt because they were fishing all night and caught nothing. However,



Peter follows the Lord's command. When Peter drops his net at the Lord's command, it is filled to the breaking point. Peter's response to this miracle is to ask the Lord to depart from him because he is a sinful man. Our Lord's response is that from now on, Peter and his partners, James and John, will catch men instead of fish.

God performs miracles to remind us that He is watchful over the world, that God governs the world and orders it. Thus, what may seem to be the natural order of things in the minds of people is disturbed by the action of God. God is the creator and order of the world. As our Lord says, "With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26). Miracles also remind us that without God they can do nothing. Saint Paul reminds us of this when he says, "I have planted, Apollos watered; but God gave the increase. So then neither is he that plants anything, neither he that waters; but God that gives the increase" (I Corinthians 3:6-7).

There is a proverb that is similar to this that says, "Men propose, but God disposes." We often have many desires in our hearts and minds. We plan many things. Many of these plans remain as unrealized ideas. Other plans get put into action, ending in failure, while still other plans are put into action, ending in success. These plans are those that were adopted by God.


The plans that are adopted by God are His, are like Him, and come from Him. All that is not from God, like God, and are not God's, are rejected by God. We are reminded of this in the Psalms, where it says, "Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it" (Psalms 127:1). If we plan or build something in our own name, it will fail; but if we plan and build to honor God, it will be successful.
