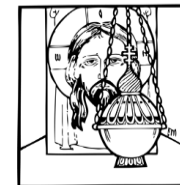

## ***Come, Lord Jesus, Come!***



What is the nature of the invitation? “Come, for look, all things are ready.” God the Father has prepared in Christ gifts for the inhabitants of the earth. Through Christ, he bestowed the forgiveness of sins, cleansing away of all defilement, communion of the Holy Spirit, glorious adoption as children, and the kingdom of heaven. To these blessings, Christ invited Israel, before all others, by the commandments of the Gospel. He has even said by the voice of the psalmist: “*But I have been sent as a king by him,*” that is, by God the Father, “*on Zion his holy mountain to preach the commandment of the Lord.*” (Psalm 2:6) (St. Cyril of Alexandria)

As we prepare for the Christmas and Theophany holy days let us not lose sight of the fact that we have been invited to a Great Feast. Let’s not let the presents, trimming and other preparations blind us to the coming of the Savior. *Come, Lord Jesus, come!*

### **Reflect:**

- What things in our life do we spend the most time being concerned about?
- If our first concern is not for God and our salvation, can we really expect to be among the chosen few?
- What things can cause us not to respond to God’s invitation?
- What practical steps can I take to be sure to make God’s invitation the most important thing in my life?
- How does my life look different if I am preparing for the wedding feast of Jesus or if I am not?

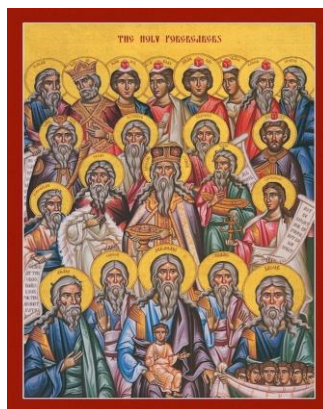

### ***Sunday of the Forefathers***

This Sunday, the second Sunday before Christmas, honors the ancestors of Christ according to the flesh, including the patriarchs and prophets of the Old Testament.

The connection to The Parable of the Great Banquet lies in the themes of invitation and inclusion. Just as the master in the parable extends his invitation to those who were initially overlooked or marginalized, Sunday of the Holy Forefathers celebrates the faith and righteousness of the Old Testament figures who awaited the coming of the Messiah. These forefathers, through their faith, became part of God's plan of salvation, which is now extended to all people through Christ.

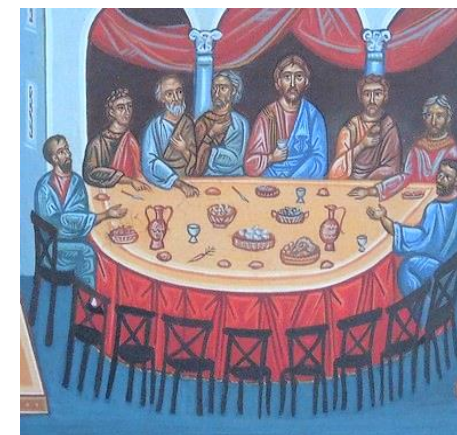


This celebration reminds us of the continuity of God's plan from the Old Testament to the New Testament, highlighting the inclusivity of God's kingdom and the importance of responding to His invitation.

### ***Second Sunday before the Nativity***

All too often when we read the Gospel we keep the words of Jesus at arm's length, never letting them sink in and really challenge our life. Why? Most of the time the reason that we would prefer to pass over our Lord's teaching in a superficial way is because his teachings are truly challenging and life changing if we allow them to have their full impact. Today's Gospel is one of those "challenging" teachings of Jesus. "Many are called but few are chosen," Jesus tells us in the Gospel today and these words are spoken to us today just as much as they were spoken to Jesus' hearers two thousand years ago. "*Many are called but few are chosen.*"



Among those who hear this Gospel passage today in the Church most will allow Jesus' words to pass over them with little or no serious consideration. A few however, hearing these words will respond to Jesus by asking how one is to be "chosen." The invitation to participate in God's life, the invitation to salvation, is offered to all, as Saint Paul says in the Epistle, "Gentile and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, Barbarian and Scythian, slave and freeman." However, not all respond to the invitation. Many then, and many today, find more important things with which to occupy their lives. The way of salvation begins with an invitation on God's part, but to that invitation we must respond in a real way. All of us are invited to the wedding banquet (heaven), but not all of us will choose to go.

Choosing to go is not simply an intellectual act – it is not a matter of mere words. To go to the wedding banquet of God we must, as any good wedding guest must do, prepare ourselves. We must make ourselves acceptable to God so that when we arrive we will be chosen to enter. Are we willing to prepare ourselves to enter into heaven or will we find something more important to do with our lives?

***By faith, You, O Christ, justified the Forefathers. Through them you betrothed yourself to a Church from all nations. The saints rejoice in glory because a glorious offspring has blossomed from their seed: the Mother who bore you without seed. Through their prayers, O Christ our God, have mercy on us.***
