

In a word, a real faster is one who withdraws from all evil.



St. Gregory of Palamas

Gregory Palamas was born in Constantinople about 1296. He became a monk at Mount Athos, near Thessalonika. He was one of the main supporters of a theory of contemplation called Hesychasm. Hesychasts claimed that by suitable spiritual disciplines, those who were contemplating could come to see the “uncreated light” of God. Their opponents said that this was impossible. It was heretical. Hesychasm was condemned and Gregory was excommunicated.

In 1347, through the unwavering support of the monks of Athos, Gregory was brought back from exile, cleared of heretical charges, and made bishop of Thessalonika. After much controversy his position was declared orthodox by the church of Constantinople in 1351. Philotheus, Patriarch of Constantinople, declared him a saint in 1368, established his feast day on November 14, and ordered a special commemoration of him on the 2nd Sunday of Lent.



Hesychasm

Hesychasm means “quietude or prayerful stillness before God.” It is prayer of the heart. Hesychasm is a gathering of thoughts and feelings in the presence of God by means of spiritual reading and prayer. It is a quiet time with God.

Dear parishioners,

We continue to press forward in the Great Fast. Note that our adult education series continues this Wednesday and this upcoming Saturday is the 3rd All Souls Saturday.

For next week, please note one schedule change. **Presanctified Divine Liturgy will be held Monday, March 9th at 6:00pm at St. George due to the Feast of the 40 Martyrs of Sebaste.** These heroic men were executed after surviving frozen water in the 4th century for their faith. We will not have Presanctified on Tuesday.

Fr. Don Voss will be coming to St. Mary's to hear Confessions on Sunday, March 15th beginning at 10:30am. Details still need confirmed, but I plan to bring in a guest confessor for St. George's as well.

Looking ahead, we will have an **Easter Basket making class at St. George's on Saturday March 28th at 10:00am** following Divine Liturgy for Lazarus Saturday. This is a great opportunity to learn the spiritual meaning of what we put into our Easter baskets and to be exposed to a beautiful Rusyn custom.

Our Holy Week schedule will be out next week. Please note that we will once again have a **parish field trip to Christ the Bridegroom Monastery for Bridegroom Matins on Wednesday, April 1st at 10:00am celebrated by Bishop Robert Pipta.** This is a wonderful opportunity to get to see a traditional Eastern Monastery. We were blessed to be able to have Mother Cecilia and Mother Gabriella visit St. George last year. The plan is to carpool up and leave from St. Mary's in Ambridge at 8:00am. We will stop for a fast-friendly meal on the way back and should be back in Ambridge by 3:00pm. Signup sheets are in the back of the Church.

Second Sunday of the Great Fast

Sinning is the act of turning away from God and His ways, trying to do things on our own. When we sin or turn away from God, we turn away from our source of strength and life. We become weak and paralysis takes over; not only physically and mentally, but worse yet, spiritually. However, the sinful character of mankind is something which we all share in common and so it takes a group effort to bring ourselves and one another back to the Source of life. But we must remember that we each have to do our own fair share of the effort. And our fair share means using the full power which God has given us.



The men who carried the mat of their friend in the Gospel share the burden of his palsied state. They not only brought him to the building where Christ was present, but they also shared his faith and made every effort to bring him directly into the presence of Christ. Great things can be accomplished through faith and if we want to come closer to God and follow His ways bad enough, we can find ways to do so. Jesus saw that they had a sincere faith and desire to become well again and so the first thing he did was to get to the root of the problem and forgive his sins to heal that gap between the man and God. After his sins were forgiven and a new life was given to the palsied man. Christ told him to pick up his mat and go home; to return to his family and friends, show them what God had done for him, and live the new life which he had received.

Today's reading offers three significant messages:

- Jesus' claim to be able to forgive sins reveals his identity as Son of God better than the miracles he performs.
- The faith of the friends was enough to capture Jesus' attention.
- There is always a communal dimension to God's healing touch.

For your reflection:

1. Am I "paralyzed" by fear or guilt because of my inability to accept God's forgiveness?
2. Do I let my friends help me to approach Jesus when I need his healing touch or does pride stand in my way?



GUEST HOMILIST

FR. LADIS J. CIZIK

Father Cizik is a Catholic Priest serving as the 'Chaplain' at St. Augustine Parish in Beaver County. He was ordained in 1987. He has offered the Traditional Latin Mass in various places around the country and world.

Besides serving in several parishes in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, he was the Executive Director and Vice President of the National Blue Army of Our Lady of Fatima and was posted at its headquarters in Washington, New Jersey from 2000 to 2003. His duties included directing the Blue Army's National Shrine of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Washington, NJ, and administration of the Blue Army's hotel for pilgrims in Fatima, Portugal, *Domus Pacis*. During this time, Father Cizik served as the Editor and as a writer for the Blue Army's official worldwide publication, *SOUL* magazine.

Father Cizik has led numerous pilgrimages to Catholic Shrines around the world, most notably to Fatima, Portugal many times, as well as numerous trips to Rome and to San Giovanni Rotondo, Italy, where St. Padre Pio served. Other countries visited on pilgrimage included: Israel, Spain, France, Mexico, Canada and various locations in the United States.

Father Cizik served as a writer for various traditional Catholic publications, including "the Remnant" newspaper and "Catholic Family News." Father served as Chaplain, since 1988, to the Divine Child Jesus Saint Padre Pio Prayer Group and, since 2003, to the Beaver Valley Blue Army of Our Lady of Fatima, both presently meeting at Saint Blaise Church in Midland.
