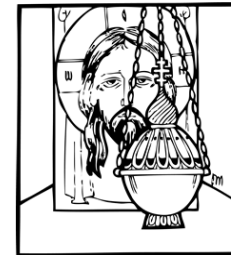

The Apostle's Fast: A Path to Renewal & Reflection

The Apostle's Fast, observed June 1 to June 28, is a time of reflection and preparation leading to the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul (June 29). These great apostles spread the Gospel with unwavering faith—Peter, the "rock" of the Church, and Paul, a former persecutor turned devoted evangelist. Their legacy calls us to deeper prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, strengthening our faith as we embrace their teachings.

Traditionally, a strict fast is observed on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays of this fast. Confession is also customary, as all fasting periods serve to spiritually prepare us for the Feast. May this season inspire us to follow in the footsteps of these holy apostles!

A Note from Fr. Anthony

Dear parishioners,

This week begins the Apostles Fast, which will continue to June 29th, the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul. During this time, traditionally no meat or dairy was consumed. It is recommended that everyone **at the very least abstain from meat on Wednesdays, in addition to Fridays** (as is already done throughout the year). While strictly speaking, additional penance outside of Friday's is "voluntary" during this time, it is of great spiritual benefit to seek to align ourselves more deeply with the traditions of the Church. **I would encourage everyone to offer up their fasting during this season for the growth of our Byzantine Catholic parishes in Beaver County.**

Please join me on Thursday at St. George as I celebrate the 4th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood. 6:00pm Divine Liturgy with a social to follow. Thanks to the parishioners of St. George for organizing this!

Finally, please RSVP by tomorrow at the latest if you wish to attend the reception following soon to be Fr. Mark Le Roy's First Divine Liturgy on Monday, June 8th at St. Mary's at 6:00pm. There will be no weekday liturgies June 9th or 10th this week.

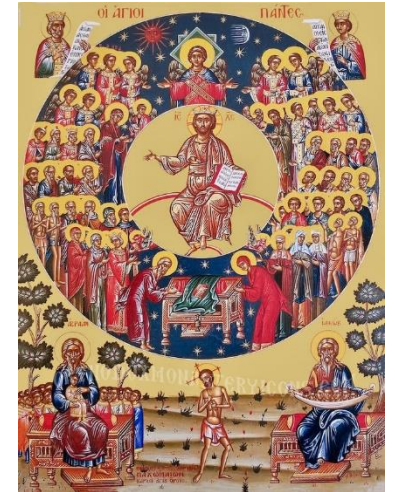

Stewardship of Time

Time on this earth is one of our greatest privileges and yet one of our biggest responsibilities. Outside of Sunday morning, how much time does God really get? The daily choices we make in our lives, how we spend our time and energy, indicate not only what we truly value but also where we will spend eternity.

Sunday of All Saints

The first Sunday after the Feast of Holy Pentecost is observed by the Eastern Church as the Sunday of All Saints. This day has been designated as a commemoration of all of the Saints, all the Righteous, the Prophets, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors, Shepherds, Teachers, and Holy Monastics, both men and women alike, known and unknown, who have been added to the choirs of the Saints and shall be added, from the time of Adam until the end of the world, who have been perfected in piety and have glorified God by their holy lives.



Confession with the Lips Leads to Salvation

Adapted from St. John Chrysostom's Homily on today's Gospel

Matthew 10:32-33 - So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven."

The Son does not here speak soothing words but instead speaks of the consequences of denial. Note carefully: It is not by some power within yourself that you make your confession but by the help of grace from above. But if you deny me the Son, he is saying, then I will deny you in the presence of the Father. Someone may then object: "How then am I to be blamed if God, forsaking me, denies me?" The answer is, your being forsaken is the fault of you yourself, the forsaken person, not of God.

"But why," you object, "should I need to confess faith with my mouth if I confess faith in my mind?" No. We must confess with our mouth in order that we may be steadily trained to speak boldly. It is only through this more abundant love and determination that we will be raised on high.

In this way Jesus addresses himself to each one of us personally. He is not here addressing only his original disciples but also every one of us who follows after his disciples in accord with their witness to him. One who learns this lesson will teach it in boldness to others, prepared to suffer all things easily and with a ready mind. That is why so many have come to have faith in the witness of the apostles and the saints to this Word.
