**Touched by Divine Light** - St. Ambrose of Milan teaches that the blind man touched by Jesus received more than just his sight. In one instant we see both the power of his divinity and the strength of his holiness. As the divine light, he touched this man and enlightened him. As priest, by an action symbolizing baptism he wrought in him his work of redemption. The only reason for his mixing clay with the saliva and smearing it on the eyes

of the blind man was to remind you that he who restored the man to health by anointing his eyes with clay is the very one who fashioned the first man out of clay, and that this clay that is our flesh can receive the light of eternal life through the sacrament of baptism. You, too, should come to Siloam, that is, to Him who was sent by the Father, as He says in the Gospel: "My teaching is not my own; it comes from Him who sent Me." Let Christ wash you, and then you will see.



#### But what are the spiritual health benefits of walking? Here are a few:


- time for prayer



the Holy Place not made by hands". He goes in order to send the Holy Spirit to bear witness to Him and His gospel in the world, making Him powerfully present in the lives of disciples.

<u>Feast of the Ascension</u> - This Thursday, May 30, is the feast of the Glorious Ascension into Heaven of our Lord, God and Savior, Jesus Christ. **It is a holy day of precept (obligation) for all Byzantine Catholics.** To commemorate this Feast we will have a Vesperal Divine Liturgy on **Wednesday, May 29 at 6:00 PM.** 

#### **Excerpts from Christ Our Pascha:**

*Enculturation of the Good News*. In this way, the one Gospel of Jesus Christ took flesh in the multitude of cultures of Christian peoples; the one Tradition of the Word of God was expressed in a diversity of traditions. Through its own tradition, every particular church makes its own contribution to the understanding of this one Tradition. (#62)



Growth in Faith: Catechumenate, Illumination, Sacramental Initiation. In the first centuries, the catechesis of non-baptized adults in the church took place in three stages: Catechumenate, Illumination, Sacramental Initiation. The Catechumenate (from the Greek katekhoumenous, meaning one being instructed) began with a presentation of the new candidate to the Christian community. With the agreement of the community, the candidate became a catechumen. The name of this person was announced to the community; and now, the Holy Scriptures would be announced to the catechumen. Such catechumens sometimes remained in the narthex of the church, which served as an outward symbol of the catechumens' inner spiritual state: they were leaving the world behind, but had not yet fully entered into the Church, the temple of the faithful. Having listened to the Word of God and the homily at the Divine Liturgy, the catechumens were obliged to leave the church after the prayer of the church community for them - the Litany for the Catechumens. Freedom Has a Cost - This is Memorial Day weekend. For some, it has little meaning other than a day off and the running of the Indianapolis 500. Yet, the origin of the day began with remembering the dead in the Civil War - the women of Pennsylvania who decorated Union graves in August of 1864, the women of Virginia who decorated Confederate graves in April of 1865, and the women of Columbus, MS who decorated the graves



of both Union and Confederate dead - prompting Horace Greeley's editorial and the subsequent events which called for national observance of such memorials. This day reminds us of all those who have died in war, hence that freedom has a cost.
