

## A Steward's Way

### A NOTE FROM FR. GEOFF

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

*"Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1.2)*

Many thanks to all of you who came out for food, fun, and fellowship last Sunday at our parish picnic. A special word of thanks is due to all those whose planning, labor, and effort went into making it a successful and joyful event.

Erin and I were especially honored by the cake welcoming us to this community. We have been moved by the kindness and warm hospitality we have received from all of you and I look forward to the future with great hope and expectation that our good and gracious God will continue to work among us to bless us and make us a blessing to others.

This week we celebrate the Dormition (or the "Falling Asleep") of the Holy Theotokos. This feast commemorates the end of our Lady's earthly life and her entrance into the life of blessedness with our Lord in the heavens. While the Western Church has historically had some controversy over whether or not they believed that Mary died before her Assumption, in the Eastern Churches, we have always commemorated her "falling asleep," a euphemistic way of referring to her death. St. Andrew of Crete, in one of his homilies, says, "Death, natural to men, also reached her; not, however, to imprison her, as happens to us, or to vanquish her... It was only to secure for her the experience of that sleep which comes from on high, leading us up to the object of our hope" (Homily 1 on the Dormition).

And yet, just like the Western Church, we also celebrate her immediate Assumption into heaven. Both her soul and her body were taken up into heaven after her Falling Asleep, as our hymns for the Feast say: "For just as he kept thee virgin in thy childbirth, so did he preserve thy body incorrupt in the tomb; and he glorified thee by a divine translation, showing thee honour as a Son to his Mother."

The Dormition of the Theotokos is, for us, a sign of the blessed hope of the Life of the Age to Come. What has been done by God for the Holy Virgin is what has been promised for all the disciples of Jesus Christ. Just as the Virgin is the greatest symbol and archetype for our submission to God's will ("be it unto me according to thy word"), so the end of her life is a sign of the coming general resurrection of all the departed.

I wish you all the joy of the Feast! And I pray that our Lord would always be drawing us closer to himself, making us ever more ready and willing to say, with his Holy Mother, "be it unto me according to thy word!"

## Blessing of Flowers and Herbs

According to our Byzantine Catholic Tradition, flowers are solemnly blessed on the Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos (August 15). From ancient times we have been taught that when Mary, the Mother God, fell asleep the whole company of the Apostles - except Thomas - was miraculously brought together in Jerusalem. Amid divine and heavenly praises they commended her soul into the hands of God and placed her body in a little tomb in Gethsemane. For three days a choir of Angels continued to sing above her tomb. And on the third day Thomas arrived. So that he could venerate the body that had given birth to Christ God, the Apostles opened the tomb. They found not the body of the Mother of God but the winding sheet and the most beautiful and sweet-smelling flowers. Mary's body had been taken up into the heavens by her Son. Flowers were blessed from the earliest times in both East and West. Over time seeds and herbs used for medicinal purposes were also blessed, in commemoration of the many healings and blessings that were bestowed upon the pilgrims at Mary's tomb. The *Book of Needs (Trebynyk or Euchologian)* contains several possible prayers to bless seed, herbs and flowers, one of which is below:



*O Almighty, God from before all ages, by Your word alone You created out of nothingness the heavens, earth, sea and all things visible and invisible. You commanded that the earth bring forth plants and trees to serve both man and animal, each according to its need. In your infinite goodness You ordained that these plants serve not only as food but also as medicine for the sick body. We beseech You, bless this seed, these herbs and these flowers and bestow upon them Your blessing and endow them with Your power. Make them to serve man and animal alike as a defense against all sickness and every defilement, for You are our God, and we send up glory to You, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.*


Blessing of Flowers and Herbs will take place at the Holy Day Divine Liturgy, **Thursday, August 15, 6:30 P.M.**

- The top "practical" reasons for hardly attending or missing Church altogether, 21 % said they don't have time or they don't get around to it.


- That 82% of the unchurched would be interested in coming to church if invited by a friend and yet in the last year only 2% of church members have invited someone!



Matthew 14:25-27 – Then he made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but the boat by this time was many furlongs distant from the land, beaten by the waves; for the wind was against them. And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, “It is a ghost!” And they cried out for fear. But immediately he spoke to them, saying, “Take heart, it is I; have no fear.” (From Sunday’s Gospel)

**"It is a ghost! And they cried out for fear."** This is the way the Lord constantly deals with our fears. He does not hesitate to bring on worse things, even more alarming than before. They were troubled here not only by the storm but also by the distance from the land. Note that He did not too easily remove the darkness. He did not come quickly to their rescue. He was training them, as I said, by the continuance of these fears and instructing them to be ready to endure.

*I Corinthians 3:9-17*


In today’s Epistle reading, St. Paul speaks of various foundations on which people build their lives; gold, silver, wood, hay... Some foundations will survive, he says; others will not.

Every one of us is building a house called life. It is a lifetime job. Everything we think, do, and say goes into the structure to become part of our life house. One day – says Our Lord – this life house will be tested to see of what material it is made. The storm will come. And whether the house stands or falls will be due not to the weather but to the material that went into it, to the foundation underneath.

A story is told of a little boy who fell out of a boat and climbed upon a rock during a storm. After he was rescued, he was asked if he had been afraid. “Sure, I was afraid,” he replied, “I trembled all over, but never once did the rock ever tremble.”

In Psalm 18: 2 we read the following” “The Lord is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer, my God in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.” Today let us ask ourselves: Are you building your life on this rock? Even though the Apostle Peter was drowning today we witness later on in Matthew 17:17-19 how Our Lord called Peter a Rock. It is on such believing, fully surrendered persons that Christ Our Savior has built His Church through the centuries. “You are Peter – a rock, and upon this rock I will build My Church.” The Apostle Peter’s faith made him a rock.

What is important for us is a foundation that holds; a foundation that does not shake; a foundation that affords security in time of need, that solid foundation is none other than Our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.


